The 2022 FIS Masters Cup and U.S. Ski & Snowboard Masters Western Regional Championships will be held in the Rocky Division at Beaver Creek, CO. The event will include 2SG, 2 one-run GS and SL races all held on the Bear Trap trail accessed by the Centennial Express Lift in the base area.

DEADLINE Sunday, January 30, 2022 (you also must [renew your FIS license](#) by this date and have an ACTIVE FIS Masters Code to be on the points list)

All racers may register online for training and races starting December 1, 2021 at: skiracereg.com/fis/races

International racers should also create an account at the link to pay in advance online. International racers should select "skiracereg.com" as their Home Race Series. **Credit cards will be charged on February 1st.**

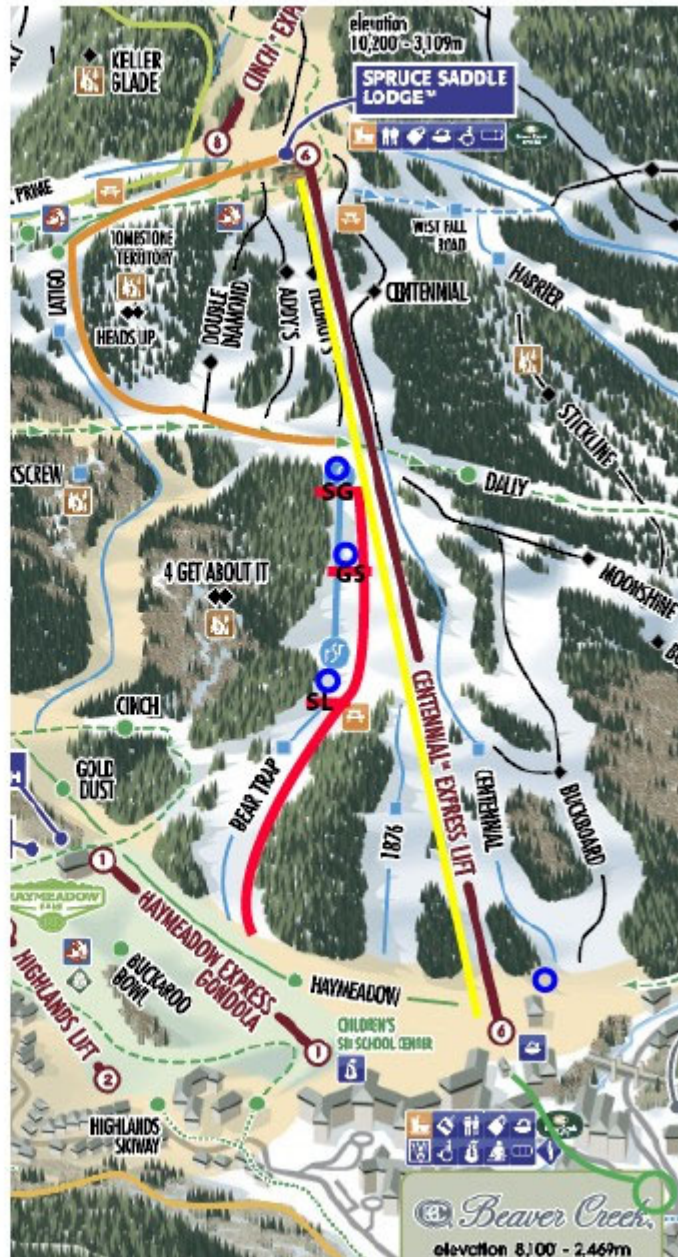

ELIGIBILITY

- FIS Masters Cup races are open to men and women age 30 and older as of December 31, 2020 with a current FIS Masters license and an ACTIVE FIS Masters Code. US competitors must have a current U.S. Ski & Snowboard masters membership as well as a current FIS masters license and an ACTIVE FIS Masters Code.
- US masters under age 30 with a current U.S. Ski & Snowboard masters membership may compete in the US Western Region Championship but are not eligible for FIS Masters awards.
- US masters and Canadians are eligible for Western Regional Championship Awards.
- USA competitors can purchase a FIS Masters License when renewing your U.S. Ski & Snowboard Membership at my.uskisandsnowboard.org. If you have already renewed you can [add a FIS Masters License](#).

If you have FIS Masters points, you MUST renew by January 28th to be on the current points list! If you renew after that date, you will not have points for start list seeding and will be placed in the unseeded group at the end of your age class.

HELMETS

It is REQUIRED that Masters use helmets that meet the FIS standards for FIS Masters GS and SG competitions which have a stamp affixed by the manufacturer that states "Conforms to FIS Specification RH 2013".

RACE HEADQUARTERS

All race documents (start lists, referee reports, results, etc) will be delivered electronically.

TEAM CAPTAINS MEETINGS (TCM)

Team Captains Meetings will be held at 6PM on Thursday after check-in at the Comfort Inn meeting room and at 4:30PM Friday and Saturday before the awards ceremony. All TCMs will be available virtually, via web or phone, and in person. The virtual link and phone number will be updated closer to the event and distributed to all registered participants via email.

RACER CHECK-IN

Bibs can be picked up at the Comfort Inn during the 4-6PM check-in period on February 4th or on the morning of your first race from 7-8AM.

BAG STORAGE

The best places to keep gear during the race day will be at the start or in the fenced area above the building next to the Centennial lift. Lodge access should be greater than last season but will be limited. No bags are allowed to be stored in the lodge. Most parking lot requires a shuttle to the base area.

WAX FACILITIES & RULES

No group tuning area available this year.

Please remember that use of fluorinated wax is now prohibited at all FIS and U.S. Ski & Snowboard Events.

COVID

Masking:

- At the time of publication, the CDC provides that, in general, masks are not needed in outdoor settings except in areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases where individuals should consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated.
- Following the CDC guidance, for unvaccinated participants, we recommend wearing a well-fitted mask both indoors and outdoors when you cannot have physical distance (at least 6 feet).
- For vaccinated participants, to maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others, U.S. Ski & Snowboard requires that participants wear a mask indoors unless actively eating/drinking and that they maintain physical distancing while doing so.

Vaccinations:

- For participants eligible to receive a [COVID-19 vaccination](#), it is highly encouraged.
- Vaccination status remains a significant factor in determining whether someone will need high-level care for COVID-19.
- The CDC has reported that vaccinated individuals are 10 times less likely to die of a COVID-19 infection than unvaccinated.
- Vaccination also helps reduce stressors on communities that host events, the medical community, children below the age of vaccination, and vulnerable individuals.

COVID-19 Symptoms:

- If you are [exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19](#) do not travel to a venue until you receive clearance from a doctor.
- Close Contact:
If you have been in close, sustained contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days, please refer to the [CDC guidance](#) on quarantine and travel requirements.

Travel:

- Participants must follow all travel restrictions and quarantine requirements of the regions and countries of travel.
- The CDC discourages travel both internationally, and domestically for all unvaccinated individuals. Based on this recommendation, out-of-region competition is discouraged for all unvaccinated athletes and coaches.
